

CTE Online/Remote Best Practices

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- Be realistic with expectations. For example, if a topic is not one that would generate a lot of discussion in an in-person setting, do not expect it to do so online.
- Be consistent. Students respond better to a consistent structure.
- Clarify purpose. Explain the “why.”
- Be specific and detailed. Students should know precisely what is expected.
- Be efficient. Avoid wasted time.
- Differentiate. Information should be attainable in various ways.
- Individualized and timely feedback. Students should be aware of how they are progressing at all times.
- Utilize a quality Learning Management System. (Google Classroom, etc.)
- Respond to inquiries in a timely manner.
- Provide multiple methods of assessment.
